ELECTRONIC REPORTING OF DEATHS TO THE PROCURATOR FISCAL

Purpose

- 1. This letter is to inform you that the Electronic Reporting of Deaths to the Procurator Fiscal will be rolled out by the Crown Office and Procurator Fiscal Service (COPFS), and NHS National Services Scotland (NSS) to NHSScotland and hospices in phases, from 18 March 2015.
- 2. In the initial phase, it will be rolled out to all GP practices in Scotland using the existing SCI gateway referral system. Roll out to hospitals, GP out of hours services and hospices will be in subsequent phases. Owing to the IT infrastructure that requires to be used in hospitals, this development will be aligned with the development of the electronic completion of the Medical Certificate of Cause of Death (eMCCD). Further information for hospitals and hospices will be provided in due course.

Background

- 3. The Scottish Fatalities Investigation Unit (SFIU) of the COPFS and NSS have developed jointly a more efficient electronic reporting process to make the reporting of deaths less bureaucratic and time consuming. This provides better outcomes for bereaved relatives, medical practitioners and SFIU staff.
- 4. Current reporting methods vary across Scotland, with the majority of the reporting done by telephone. The overall process takes a significant amount of time for NHSScotland, hospices and SFIU staff in getting the appropriate information for each death reported. This can impact on relatives of the deceased at a particularly difficult time for them, as well as impacting significantly on the resources of the organisations involved.

Further Enquiries

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- 5. The new electronic reporting will utilise existing IT applications and infrastructure for the secure electronic transfer of information between NHSScotland, hospices and SFIU.
- 6. Doctors working in the private sector wishing to report deaths should continue to contact the relevant SFIU team by telephone at which time the report may be taken by telephone or they may be asked to complete a form eF5 and email this to SFIU. Any other individual with concerns about a death may contact SFIU by telephone or in writing with details of their concerns.

Transitional Arrangements

- 7. The programme for this development has been in place for over a year, with input from clinicians. Part of the work of the programme has included piloting the process in a number of hospices in several Health Board areas.
- 8. In addition, some GPs in North Lanarkshire have been submitting the reports as an attachment to an email. SFIU offices in the North of Scotland have also adopted this email method as an interim method to the electronic solution.
- 9. As the electronic reporting method is rolled out to the various parts of NHSScotland, reporting doctors will be expected to submit reports electronically via Form eF5. Decisions made by the PF or requests for additional information will be communicated to the reporting doctor as an electronic alert, supported by a telephone call. **A copy of the form eF5 is in Annex A.**
- 10. Where the electronic route via Form eF5 is not available, current local arrangements will continue (telephone and email reporting), until such time as the preferred route (electronic) is available.
- 11. The intention is to replace telephone and email submissions to the Procurator Fiscal (PF) as soon as the organisations in each Health Board have access to the electronic solution. A flowchart to explain the process is in Annex B.
- 12. It is important to note that this development does not exclude the opportunity for a doctor to contact SFIU by telephone for advice on whether a death needs to be reported to the PF. Subsequently, where SFIU decide that a report is necessary, they will also advise on the reporting method, appropriate to the circumstances. Training

- 13. Training support for reporting to the PF will be through existing channels as advised by clinicians on the programme steering group. **For example,** the SCI Gateway training guide, "Working with COPFS messages for clinicians" is available to GP practices, as well as other materials such as laminated sheets, to address local circumstances. IT facilitators are also in place to train any new users in primary care.
- 14. The sections addressing reporting to PF in the guidance for doctors on how to complete the Medical Certificate of Cause of Death, published by Scottish Government and National







Records of Scotland in 2014, may also be helpful. The guidance is available through the link below.
