2. Annual General Meeting 2006:

2.1 Minute of AGM of 31 May 2006

2.4 Election of Office Bearers

Convenor

Vice-Convenors

Michael McMahon MSP proposed Roseanna Cunningham MSP and this proposal was seconded by Dorothy McElroy.

Secretary/Treasurer
