# COVID-19: Collaborative Compassionate Care

Supporting employees during COVID-19

#### BACKGROUND

In March 2020, Kilbryde Hospice agreed to support NHS Lanarkshire (NHSL) to address the service and population challenges that COVID-19 presented to South Lanarkshire. The Senior Management Team (SMT), whilst keen to support NHS, were equally concerned about the impact of such swift changes on staff across the organisation during this challenging time. Allen (2016) proposes a period of detailed analysis and preparatory work prior to any change however the Kilbryde team understood that we needed to rise to the challenges quickly without any formal preparation .Following our return to providing specialist palliative care as a Hospice, SMT wished to establish the impact on staff and action plan accordingly.


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
## AIMS

- To establish the impact on all hospice staff relating to the changes in working practice due to COVID-19
- To establish if SMT were making the correct decisions on behalf of staff and volunteers




# METHOD

- Smart survey sent to all clinical and nonclinical staff by email/paper format.
- Returned forms (n=39) collated. Data and themes identified.

### RESULTS

- 73% of staff worried about the impact of COVID-19 on themselves
- 70% worried about the impact of COVID-19 on hospice
- 85% of staff felt SMT were making the right decisions
- 83% of staff were confident they had the correct resources to work during crisis
- 67% of staff working remotely felt they could continue for a limited period

### CONCLUSION

- SMT feel reassured that support has been valued by staff
- Support uptake has been mixed but readily available
- Staff feel that SMT are making the correct decisions on their behalf
- If necessary, staff could continue working remotely for future short periods
