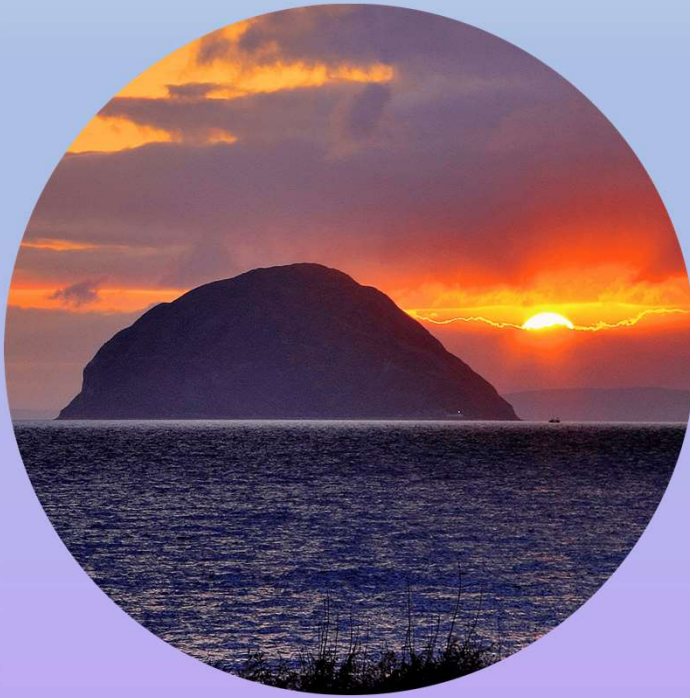

Who Are No-One Dies Alone Companions?

They are ordinary members of the public who are trained in end of life changes/ issues and have a kind heart. They provide a nourishing presence for you or your loved one who is dying, helping to share the load. They understand the difficulties people can face at this time, especially when they are alone or feel alone. All of our companions are open minded and many are nurses or ex nurses, care workers and others who have a caring nature. They are trustworthy, good listeners and are respectful in your home. They are devoted to ensuring no-one dies alone and are naturally attentive, responding to whatever situation they find themselves in a conscientious way.



How To Make A Referral



We accept referrals from anyone via telephone. Our volunteers are always on hand via a secure online rota where they receive only the town they are needed in.

No private information is posted.

Each volunteer who can offer support then receives a telephone call with brief essential information such as address. We can usually attend within a few hours as we have almost 40 volunteers covering the whole of Ayrshire. Each referral is tailored to suit the individual and work around care plans already in place.
