


End of Life Clinical Simulation

Safe environment

It gave insight on how others view death, their experiences and beliefs

It was a reminder that there is still life before death.....

Offered differing perspectives to consider

It made me realise that everyone has different wishes or desires before they die.

It made the subject of dying more open to talk about in class and at home with my own family. It made it easier for me to adapt my responses to individuals and families

Encouraged me not to fear the words 'death & 'dying'

It made me think about life goals etc., and that patients and families have these goals also....

It made me think about how different each person's experience will be and what is important to every individual at the last moments of their life
